Every year, Forest Produce is estimated to create 10 million workdays across the country



Forest Produce is also referred to as Minor Forest Produce (MFP) or Non Timber Forest Produce (NTFP)

The key Forest Produce are: Lac | Tamarind | Mahua Flower | Tendu Leaves | Sal | Chironji | Mango | Mahua Fruits | Silk Cocoons | Bamboo | Kullu Gum | Resin

In the 1860's, the British restricted communities' right to MFP

1980's: Forest Policy recognizes the importance of MFP to communities but has no legally binding provisions

1990's: Joint Forest Management is mooted with community participation in management and resource use


1996: Panchayat (Extension to Scheduled Areas) Act gives ownership of MFP to communities

2008: Forest Rights Act comes into force in 2008, giving communities rights to conserve and manage all MFP (defined as everything that is not timber and timber products)

2010: Idea of Minimum Support for MFP mooted

August **2013**: Ministry of Tribal Affairs announces Minimum Support Price for Minor **Forest Produce**







MFP is estimated to have a dependent population of 100 million
